

Knit Dress - Sewing Pattern #4820

Recommendations on fabric: natural/mixed knit fabric of medium stretchiness in contrasting or similar color.

You will also need: knit fusible interfacing.

Seam allowances: all seams 1 cm. Seam allowance for hem of garment and hem of sleeve – 2 cm.

Note on seam allowances:

- If the pattern has double contour the seam allowances are included. They are 1 cm unless specified otherwise.
- If the pattern has single contour, the seam allowances are NOT included and need to be added when laying out the pattern.



Attention! The amount of fabric needed for your pattern is not included. It will depend on the selected pattern size, the width, and design of the fabric you plan to use. First, print all the paper patterns and lay them out at the width of fabric you plan to use (usually from 90 to 150 cm). Measure how much fabric you will need. Don't forget to account for pieces that need to be cut multiple times and pieces that are cut on the fold.



Note on working with stretchy fabric:

Knitted fabric pieces are sewn together with special elastic or narrow zig-zag stitch. Seam allowance on hems can be stitched with twin needles to save stretchiness. Pieces can also be sewn together with a serger. When serging, cut seam allowances to 0.6 – 0.8 cm.

CUTTING:

Note on cutting:

On the pattern pieces, "beam" means straight of grain. Lay out your pieces accordingly. Some pieces will be cut on the fold. This is noted on the pattern piece. Mark all notches and other design features such as pleats etc. from the pattern onto your fabric.

When sewing the garment, pay attention to notches, they must match up.

Main fabric:

- 1. Upper back cut 1 on fold
- 2. Upper front cut 1 on fold



- 3. Lower back cut 1 on fold
- 4. Lower front cut 1 on fold

Main fabric 1:

- 1. Back inset cut 1 on fold
- 2. Front inset cut 1 on fold
- 3. Back neck facing cut 1
- 4. Front neck facing cut 1

Fusible interfacing:

- 1. Back neck facing cut 1
- 2. Front neck facing cut 1

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Apply fusible interfacing.
- 2. Sew back inset to upper back, press seam allowances towards inset and serge. Sew upper backs to lower backs, press towards top and serge.
- 3. Sew front inset to upper front, press seam allowances towards inset and serge. Sew upper front to lower front, press towards top and serge.
- 4. Sew shoulder seams, press towards the back and serge.
- 5. Sew side seams sewing the sleeve edges at the same time, press towards the back and serge.
- 6. Sew shoulder seams of facings, press the seam apart. Serge the outer edge. Pin facings to garment right sides together and sew the neckline. Clip into curves, turn the facings onto the wrong side and press. Baste facings to shoulder seams.
- 7. Serge hem and lower edge of sleeves, press onto wrong side and topstitch.
